



Troops 139 & 140 Are Safe Haven Troops

A Safe Haven is:

1. Setting the example—each patrol/troop member follows the Scout Oath and Law.
2. Each member refuses to tolerate name-calling, put-downs, physical aggression or hazing toward any other member.
3. Each member communicates acceptance and respect for others.
4. These practices create an environment based upon learning and having fun—a “safe haven”.
5. By seeking the best, we achieve the best.

A Safe Haven is put into practice by:

1. Training of every member of the Patrol Leaders Council and each member agrees to carry it out.
2. The members of the PLC set the standard for the members of their Patrols/Troop.
3. When someone is having trouble following these standards, another member will “invoke the concept” by saying “Hey remember! Safe Haven! This acts as a simple, non-threatening reminder.”
