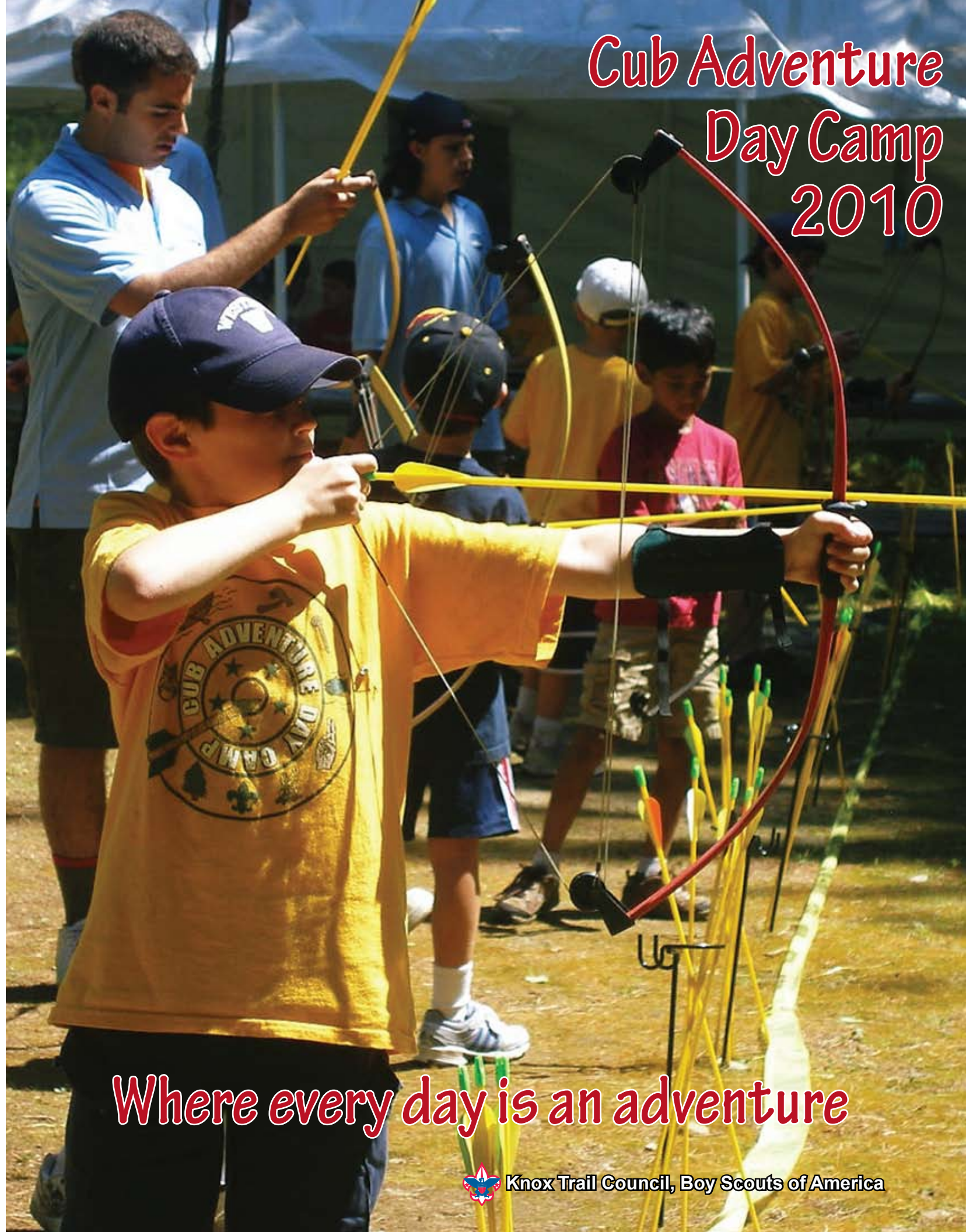

2010 Cub Adventure Day Camp Information

The Knox Trail Council, Boy Scouts of America is pleased to invite boys completing grades 1 through 4 to attend Cub Adventure Day Camp. No Scouting experience is required. The camp surpasses all State of Massachusetts requirements and receives the highest camp rating by the Boy Scouts of America. Campers participate in age appropriate outdoor adventures under the guidance of a caring, friendly, and qualified staff.

Supervision
Cub Adventure Day Camp programs are administered by qualified staff trained by the Boy Scouts of America. All staff have successfully completed Youth Protection training and basic First Aid. The safety of our campers is our first priority. The Day Camp program emphasizes character development, personal fitness, and good citizenship.

Location
The camp is located at 129 Hudson Road (Route 85) in Bolton, Massachusetts. The E. Paul Robstam Scout Reservation is owned and operated by the Knox Trail Council, Boy Scouts of America.

Registration
Registrations will be accepted online, by mail, fax, or in person at the Knox Trail Scout Service Center, 490 Union Avenue, Frammingham, MA 01702. Fax 508-872-9092. No telephone reservations will be accepted. Online registration available at www.go2cadc.org.

Fees
\$335 per week - Early bird discount of \$30 applies if fee is paid before May 1, 2010. Second week at camp is only \$249, and any third or more week is only \$229 per week.

Non-Registered Scouts
If your child is NOT a registered Cub Scout, you must complete the application to join a Cub Scout Pack and pay the \$28.00 fee. This fee includes monthly issues of Boys' Life magazine and Sickness and Accident Insurance.

Camperships

Refund Policy
All fees must be paid in full at time of registration. There is a \$50 per week nonrefundable cancellation fee. After June 1, refunds issued for medical reasons only. All refund requests must be made in writing no later than August 31, 2010.

Volunteer
We encourage volunteers at Cub Adventure Day Camp. You must sign-up and pay the camp fee in full by May 1st. After attending all five days you will be refunded the full camp fee. All volunteers must attend a training session prior to camp.

What to Wear
Campers will receive one T-shirt with a paid registration. The T-shirt will be distributed on the first day of camp. Additional T-shirts can be purchased online with registration, or at the Camp Trading Post, along with ice cream, snacks, and souvenirs. Campers are required to wear sneakers and socks. No sandals allowed. Water shoes are optional.

Lunch
Each child is expected to provide their own lunch. The lunch should be brown bag style. Even though we have access to on-site refrigeration, it is strongly recommended not to use any nonperishable products in your child's lunch. Plenty of water will be provided during the days activities.

Hours of Operation
Monday - Thursday: Camp begins at 9:00am and ends at 4:00pm.
Friday: Camp begins at 9:00am and ends at 6:00pm. There is a Family BBQ and Campfire on Friday afternoon. There is NO bus service Friday afternoon.

Health History
The Commonwealth of Massachusetts requires a completed health history signed by a parent. A copy of the health form can be downloaded at www.go2cadc.org. Your Cub must bring the form on the first day of camp.

Medical Attention
Certified medical personnel are on duty all day in the camp Health Lodge. Medications are stored in a safe, locked storage compartment, and are dispensed by the camp's Health Officer. The camp has working agreements with area Rescue Squads and local hospitals in case of emergencies. A physician is on call at all times.

Massachusetts Department of Public Health
This camp must comply with regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (105 CMR 430.000), and be licensed by the Nastroba Associated Boards of Health, Ayer, MA. Information on 105 CMR 430.000 can be obtained at 617-983-6761.

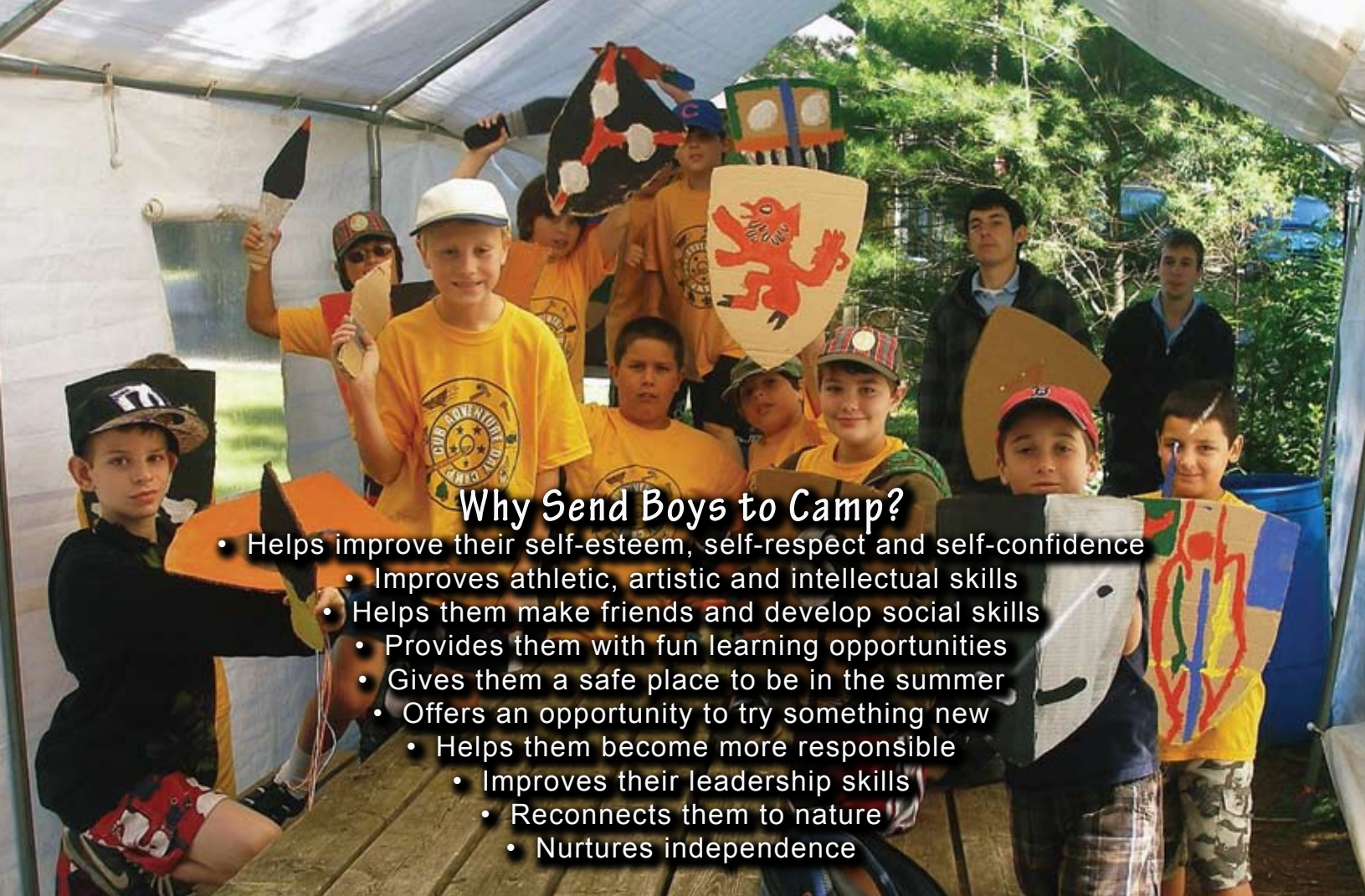

Swimming

Your child will participate in recreational swim sessions in our pond under the supervision of certified lifeguards. Every child takes a BSA swim test which determines his ability in the water.



Fishing

Campers can test their angling skills in Little Pond which has been stocked with trout, sunfish, and the elusive small-mouthed bass. Campers may bring their own fishing gear or use poles and equipment supplied by the camp.

Field Sports and Games

Cub Adventure Day Camp offers whiffle ball, volleyball, kickball and other activities. Campers can also relax with one of our board games on the shaded porch of Jewett Lodge.

Boating and Canoeing

Little Pond provides an ideal setting for instruction and usage of row boats, canoes, and paddle boats under the watchful eyes of certified instructors and lifeguards. All boaters wear Coast Guard certified Personal Floatation Devices (PFD).

Archery & BB Shooting

At the archery and BB ranges, boys get to perfect their bow and arrow and BB skills. This takes place under the guidance of certified instructors who ensure safety and proper technique.



Nature, Scoutcraft, and Hikes

Nature classes, Scoutcraft, and hikes are held on the 305 acres of ponds, streams and fields in the beautiful living outdoor wilderness where years of Scouting expertise can be shared with our campers.

Climbing Wall

Campers use their agility and strength to scale across this challenging wall.

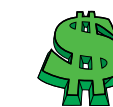

The Cub Adventure Day Camp Program provides an introduction to Scouting's Outdoor Program. Activities are conducted in an outdoor setting, close to home and during daylight hours.

We offer Cub Adventure Day Camp for boys completing grades 1-4. Programs include archery, BB shooting, arts and crafts, boating, fishing, hiking, nature and ecology, Scoutcraft skills, sports and games, team building activities, plus a pond for those hot summer days!

The six one-week sessions begin July 5, July 12, July 19, July 26, August 2, and August 9. Hours are Monday - Thursday 9am - 4pm, and Friday 9am to 6pm including a Family BBQ and Campfire.
